Head of Campus Update



We will be holding our Sports Day on Tuesday 8 February. This is focused on athletics with fun adapted events for the younger children. Students will need to come to school in their PE kit in the morning. We have recently added a long jump to the facilities in the field and this is one of the athletics events that many students are currently learning and practising for in their PE lessons.



Primary

This week Year 1 and 2 students have been learning how to extend their writing by using expanded noun phrases. The children have challenged themselves with their fraction knowledge and have been very interested about finding different countries on a map. Year 3 continue to work hard in every subject, and are full of enthusiasm for learning. This week

was the start of their ASA and the children have chosen the activities they would like to do. On Tuesday they used cocoa powder and other things to try and make mixtures. It was great fun. In IPC, the Year 4 students continued the topic 'Chocolate'. They investigated the history of chocolate, focusing on the ancient Aztec civilisation and their lifestyles, art, religion and beliefs. They also created a timeline sequencing the Aztec period into chronological order. Year 5 began to learn about first aid and how we can use it in emergency situations. This was linked to our learning on the body systems. Students worked hard to learn tricky

language and present their findings! Year 6 have written some excellent adventure stories, which they performed for the class. The students added sound effects, character voices, actions and changed the pitch and volume of their voices. Everyone enjoyed listening and performing the suspenseful stories.
