#### **Primary**

This week, Year 1 and Year 2 have been looking at capacity in mathematics and instructional writing in English. This linked to this term's IPC topic of food, which has led to some great design technology lessons. It has been an exciting and interesting week for Year 3 with lots of science activities. In one lesson the children were lucky to have Dr Alex come in from secondary and explain in detail how to carry out a 'fair test'. In another lesson Year 3 went into the secondary cooking area and completed an investigation about chocolate. As if those great experiences were not enough, the activity chosen for ASA this week was 'making slime', which involved lots of accurate measuring and following of instructions. In IPC, the Year 4 students concluded the topic 'Chocolate'. They used their own recipe to make chocolate chip cookies, and designed and made the packaging for these. They then took them home for their family to eat and evaluate. Year 5 have continued to learn about electricity and this week completed research on renewable energy sources and how we can become more sustainable. They are working on improving their research and presentation skills and are becoming more and more confident when sharing their knowledge with others. We are coming to the end of this IPC topic now and have had a lot of fun learning! After studying electrical circuits last week, Year 6 has been learning about renewable and non-renewable energy sources. Students researched about wind, solar, water and nuclear energy sources. They discussed their advantages and disadvantages and provided an explanation of how it works.

They are committed to improving the quality of life for people with Down syndrome and promoting their right to be included on a full and equal basis with others. The funds raised by Dr Alex will be shared equally between these charities.
