
Primary

Year 1 and Year 2 students have been creating coins that they had designed earlier in the term and making 'wanted' posters for some naughty pirates. In mathematics Year 1 students have continued to learn about the place value of numbers to 20. In Year 2 students have started to learn about multiplication. Year 3 have learned a lot this week in IPC about Tutankhamun - and researched who the archeologist was that found the tomb, and when. They have also continued their writing about Leon and the Place Between. The story is really magical, and has helped the

children produce some really descriptive writing. Year 4 has produced some excellent final results with their design technology projects: designing a game using knowledge that they acquired while learning about the Ancient Egyptians in their IPC topic: Temples, Tombs and Treasure. The children have also, this week, made their own



adventure comics in **English and computing** lessons. Year 5 has been busy writing poems inspired by their class book. The King of the Sky is set in Wales and deals with some challenging concepts, which the students have empathised with. They have learned all about racing pigeons and the pigeons who were awarded medals for their bravery and work delivering messages during WWII. The students have produced some excellent poems, information booklets and fact files. In English, the Year 6 students planned, wrote and edited their
