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Virtual London Marathon

Biology Week

Students from across the school have been taking part in the Biology Week Photography Competition, where they observe the living things

around them and take pictures for their House. There have been some amazing photographs taken such as plants, a variety of snails and bugs, snakes, birds, including a hornbill on the school site and beautiful squirrels. Well done to everyone who took part. The winning house is to be announced on Tuesday 4 October. This coming week is Space Week, so there are plenty more opportunities for students to get involved in some special activities and competitions.



Year 10 Research

The Year 10 EAL class has been learning about microbeads which come from polyethylene (PE), polyethylene terephthalate (PET), nylon (PA), polypropylene (PP) and polymethyl

methacrylate (PMMA). These microbeads are found mostly in personal care products. The class has undertaken extensive research into how microbeads impact on the environment and our health. The students found an app they downloaded called 'Beat the Microbead', which allows consumers to scan the ingredients of a product and discover whether or not microbeads are present. The students discovered microbeads in toothpaste, sunscreen and facewash! The students have also researched alternatives to mass-produced products that are safer for people and the environment. They became very interested in home-made soap. Luckily, Dr Paeng, the Director of our school, makes soap as a hobby. Dr Paeng visited the class and talked about how she makes soap using local ingredients. The students found the talk to be very illuminating. They especially liked the gifts of home-made soap Dr Paeng graciously gave them. Thank you very much Dr Paeng for sharing your hobby.

Primary

Year 1 and Year 2 students have been working hard writing a newspaper article, they needed to remember to use a range of punctuation such as full stops, exclamation marks and question marks. In mathematics Year 1 children have been using part whole models to find parts of numbers to 10. Year 2 children have been drawing pictorial images to count in 2s and 5s. Year 3 has worked really well in teams this week - cooperating with one another to plan and build a bridge out of straws. This was part of their lesson looking at landmarks across the world in IPC. Year 4 students have been revising addition in mathematics, adding two 4-digit numbers. In English the students have finished their class novel, Oliver and the Seawigs and are retelling the story in comic form in a joint ICT and English project! Year 5 students are continuing their learning of the Romans. This week they had a focus on the Roman Army and the soldiers who came from all over the Roman Empire. Students learned



some fascinating things about Roman armour and about the daily life of a soldier. Year 5 will be finishing off their topic with some self study, project work and research. After finishing and evaluating their Roman shield, sword and helmet, the Year 6 students focussed on Roman buildings and landmarks. They found out about Roman houses, the Colosseum, and theatres and created a tourist travel brochure for Ancient Rome.
